

- 1. Witness statement must be filled out correctly and completely with the number of signatures for that sheet. <u>Do not count</u>, crossed out signature lines in the total.
- 2. The sheets of a petition shall be numbered sequentially at the foot of each sheet. *Election Law §6215.1*
- 3. All petitions containing 10 or more sheets shall be accompanied by a cover sheet. *Election Law §6215.2*
- 4. Any two or more petition sheets shall be securely fastened together by any means which will hold the pages together in numerical order. Staplers are available on the table.
- 5. For Designating Petitions, any person running under a party that they are not enrolled in, must file an Acceptance Form. An Authorization Form will be sent from the party you are seeking acceptance from.

Campaign Finance Filing Requirements

County and City offices - CF01

Candidates running for county or city offices must file a CF-01 on each of the dates listed on the Campaign Finance Filing Calendar (see reverse).

Town offices - CF05 or CF01

Candidates running for a town position may file either a CF-05 or a CF-01

A <u>CF-05</u> is a Candidate of Committee Claim of Exemption from Filing Campaign Financial Disclosure Reports and is available to:

- Candidates who will not receive or spend more than \$50.00 for their campaign, including their own funds.
- Treasurers of committees formed solely to support or oppose ballot propositions and will not raise or spend over \$100.00 relative to the ballot proposition
- Candidate for public office or treasurer of an authorized committee solely supporting one candidate for public office or treasurer of a committee solely supporting or opposing a ballot proposition; and the receipts or expenditures of the candidate or committee will not exceed \$1000.00 in the aggregate for the campaign.

The CF-05 form is filed with the County Board of Elections when a candidate declares their candidacy. This form is filled only once and must be notarized.

Once you have received or spent \$1,000 (as a result of receipts or expenses) you must file with the NYS Board of Elections. Once you are required to file with the NYS Board of Elections all filing from that point on will be done with the NYS Board of Elections.

Candidates who spend their own money must account for that money as money received.
